Therapeutic Recreation - The Recreation and Park Management Program (housed in the Department of Community and Therapeutic) at UNC Greensboro, was initially accredited in October of 1981. The program prepares students in two concentrations: 1) Community Recreation and Event Planning and 2) Therapeutic Recreation. The Therapeutic Recreation (TR) (also known as Recreational Therapy) degree program provides students with the requirements necessary to become certified and licensed in North Carolina. TR students take courses such as assessment, clinical procedures, facilitation techniques, abnormal psychology, human development, anatomy/physiology, helping skills, and medical terminology. TR students also can minor in areas such as human development, gerontology, psychology, or sign language.
